


We are very privileged to have access to such an outstanding facility, and the continuation of behavior reflecting our biblical principles can help ensure we can continue to use it in future years!



- Now the word of the Lord came unto Jonah the son of Amittai, saying, 1
- 2 Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and cry against it; for their wickedness is come up before me.
- 3 But Jonah rose up to flee unto Tarshish from the presence of the Lord, and went down to Joppa; and he found a ship going to Tarshish: so he paid the fare thereof, and went down into it, to go with them unto Tarshish from the presence of the Lord.
- But the Lord sent out a great wind into the sea, and there was a mighty tempest in the sea, so that the ship was like to be broken.
- 5 Then the mariners were afraid, and cried every man unto his god, and cast forth the wares that were in the ship into the sea, to lighten it of them. But Jonah was gone down into the sides of the ship; and he lay, and was fast asleep.
- 6 So the shipmaster came to him, and said unto him, What meanest thou, O sleeper? arise, call upon thy God, if so be that God will think upon us, that we perish not.
- And they said every one to his fellow, Come, and let us cast lots, that we may know 7 for whose cause this evil is upon us. So they cast lots, and the lot fell upon Jonah.
- Then said they unto him, Tell us, we pray thee, for whose cause this evil is upon us; What is thine occupation? and whence comest thou? what is thy country? and of what people art thou?
- And he said unto them, I am an Hebrew; and I fear the Lord, the God of heaven, which hath made the sea and the dry land.
- 10 Then were the men exceedingly afraid, and said unto him. Why hast thou done this? For the men knew that he fled from the presence of the Lord, because he had told them.
- 11 Then said they unto him, What shall we do unto thee, that the sea may be calm unto us? for the sea wrought, and was tempestuous.
- 12 And he said unto them, Take me up, and cast me forth into the sea; so shall the sea be calm unto you: for I know that for my sake this great tempest is upon you.

#### What is a Cetacean?

Ce-ta-cean is a latin term that scientist use to identify the types of animals below. Cetus is a latin term referring to a large sea creature, the Greek related word Ketos means whale or sea monster.

The Hebrew word **FISH** in the King James Bible is Strong's concordance number #1709.

This does not give us any clue as to what type of fish God had prepared to swallow Jonah.

The only clue that we get with careful Bible reading is the word **GREAT** #1419.

Therefore we can conclude that whatever animal swallowed Jonah we know it was BIG!

#### What can we learn from the life of Jonah?

The book of Jonah provides many powerful life lessons that we can learn from today. He delivers us real life examples of struggles that we all face at some point in our life.

No matter where you go in life YOU CAN'T RUN FROM GOD.

We read

"The eyes of the Lord are in every place, beholding the evil and the good."

#### Proverbs 15:3

God is everywhere watching and waiting for our lives to unfold.

We also learn that **OBEDIENCE IS BETTER THAN SACRIFICE**.

Jonah should have trusted God and listened the first time. Jonah's disobedience led to a storm that endangered the lives of others. Our choices affect more than just ourselves. If we listen to God first and foremost in our life we can avoid unpleasant consequences. Samuel says to Saul:

"Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams."

1 Samuel 15:22

"As for God, his way is perfect: the word of the Lord is tried: he is a buckler to all those that trust in him." Psalm 18:30

When we fall short of our high calling we are also reminded that God gives us second chances IF we turn to him for help. **FAILURE DOESN'T DISQUALIFY YOU.** It's a reminder that we can't do things on our own, God wants us to trust in him completely

"But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellency of the power may be of God, and not of us." 2 Corinthians 4:7

God's perspective of the world that we live in and the events that occur is so much bigger than our limited view. Our human minds focus on the small personal discomforts instead of seeing the bigger picture of grace, love and redemption.

Jonah's life is a mirror to our own, with the transformation of his character. Jonah recognized that true repentance comes from the heart, and than no one, not even the Ninevites are beyond God's redemptive purposes.

And last we consider Jonah's struggle with pride and judgement that he brought to the story. Jonah, like ourselves struggle with pride and wanted the destruction of Nineveh rather than their salvation. Our High calling is to serve. **GOD'S WILL ISN'T ALWAYS ALIGNED WITH OUR EMOTIONS AND PREFERENCES**. For God says

"For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways" Isaiah 55:8

In Conclusion, Jonah's life is about grace, responsibility and the vast wideness of God's mercy, plan and purpose with this earth.
